Football season comes to an end

This year the football season was cut a little bit shorter than the coaches and players wanted it to due to not making it in to the playoffs. The boys finished the season with a record of 3-6. They are looking to come back strong next year with only losing one senior, Jeffrey Bunkers. Bunkers has been out for football for the Wolves since his freshman year, and this year he contributed eight solo tackles and twelve assist tackles on the season. Jeffrey will be missed by the team. The senior would like to offer some words of advice for the younger players. "Every drive, every yard, every inch is worth everything you got!"

Some of the statistic leaders for the Wolves this year are Lucas Gunderson with 283 rushing yards averaging 3.9 yards per carry for 5 touchdowns. Dylan Meyer was second on the team with 71 rushing yards averaging 2.4 yards per carry. Issac Ihnen led the team with 42 receptions for 619 yards averaging 14.7 yards per catch scoring 12 touchdowns. Edgar Tapia led the team with the most kick off return yards with 339 yards averaging 28.3 yards per return.

On the defensive side of the game, Lucas Gunderson led the way in tackles with 73 solo tackles and 51 tackle assists. Edgar Tapia had a total of 56.5 tackles with 44 of them being solo tackles. Julian Burdorf was third on the team in tackles with 50.5. Dylan Meyer led the team in fumble recoveries with three, and Tate Gilmore was second on the team with 2 fumble recoveries.

The JV team finished the season with a record of 2-2. These players were able to get in a couple of more games to further their skills to be ready to maybe come up and help at the varsity level in the years to come.

This year the Wolves were able to have five people on All-District teams. Abdulla Elbuytari is the lone wolf on 1st Team All-District. Issac Ihnen, Lucas Gunderson, and Bubba Sohn were put on 2nd Team All-District. Edgar Tapia was put on Honorable Mention. Abdulla Elbuytari, Isaac Ihnen, Lucas Gunderson, Dylan Meyer, and Brody Sohn were able to focus on the academic side while being a student-athlete and made academic all-district.
